CHAPTER 1

ALTAR VERSUS ALTARS

An *Altar* is a raised or designated place where sacrifices are made to deities.

It is a place where humanity meets with divinity.

Biblical altars were generally structures of earth (**Ex. 20:24**) or of hewn stones (**Ex. 20:25**) on which sacrifices were offered. They were generally erected in conspicuous places (**Gen. 22:9**).

The first altar specifically mentioned in the Bible was the one erected by Noah (**Gen. 8:20**), although we assume that Adam and the pre-flood patriarchs also used altars for their sacrifices. The first blood sacrifices were mentioned in connection with Adam and Eve (God shedding animal blood to make covering for them) and their son Abel's offering (**Gen. 3:21, 4:3-4**). Altars were also erected by the patriarch Abraham (**Gen. 12:7, 13:4, 22:9**); by his son Isaac (**Gen. 26:25**) and by Jacob (**Gen. 33:20, 35:1,3**) as well as Moses (**Ex. 17:15** Jehovah Nissi).

It is thus a place of worship. It is a place where humanity enters into covenant with divinity. An altar is a place where sacrifices to deities are made.

Sacrifice is an offering of an animal, something precious or of great value to a deity or deities for propitiation, protection, intervention, vindication, appeasement, covenant, solution, etc.

An altar however, has no power until sacrifice is made on it. Therefore, sacrifice is the power and the voice of an altar.

Sacrifice connotes something of great value. It involves the shedding of blood or killing of something because whatever is brought to the altar for sacrifice *must die*.

Altar versus altars is a spiritual war between two altars: God's altar and demonic altars against our lives and destinies. It is thus a war between the negative voices speaking against us from the family altars and God's voice from God's altar.

Right from the Old Testament, altar has been a place of shedding of blood. In **Lev. 17:11**, the Bible declares that blood is life and life is blood. It means that blood has voice, and if blood has voice and it is life (which, of course, does not die) then it means that blood speaks. The blood is to speak for atonement for our souls.

Gen. 4:10 “...*the voice of thy brother's blood crieth unto Me from the ground.*” When Abel was murdered, his blood spoke to God. It was the voice of his blood that God heard.

Blood has voice and speaks. It therefore means that altars have voice through the blood from the sacrifices. Sacrifices therefore become the medium of communication between humanity and divinity at the altar.

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
